above (adv): in higher place; more than

Example sentences:

"The kite was flying above."

"The birds were sitting above on the power lines."

"Water was leaking from above."

"The books are located on a shelf high above."

"Her grades are above average."

"The temperature has been above normal for the past couple of weeks."

above (prep): in higher place than something; more than something

Example sentences:

"The plane was flying above the clouds."

"The balloon disappeared above the clouds."

"We hung our wedding photo above our headboard."

"We live above a bakery."

"I could see smoke above the trees."

"The apartment is located above the garage."

above (adj): mentioned earlier

Used with nouns:

"Please refer to the above paragraph."

(paragraph, email, sentence, choices, options, questions)

above (n): something or someone higher in position or place

Example sentences:

"My answer is none of the above."

"My answer is all of the above."

A

a (indef. art.): used before a singular noun that starts with a consonant letter when referring to something; used in place of one when it comes before a word that starts with a used before a singular noun that starts with a consonant letter when referring to something; used in place of one when it comes before a word that starts with a consonant

Used with nouns:

"A man walked into the store."
(man, woman, person, customer, patron)

"He has a car."
(car, house, job) *many additional nouns

"I need a pencil."
(pencil, job, towel, car, room, chair, seat) *many additional nouns

"Do you have a piece of paper?"
(piece of paper, cigarette, watch, second, minute, moment) *many additional nouns

Used with verbs:

"She is a customer."
(be: is/am/are)

"He has a big house."
(has, owns, rents, lives in, resides in)

Used with adjectives:

"A large brick fell from the building."
(large, huge, big, heavy, red)

"She bought a black dress."
(black, red, blue, white, green) *many additional adjectives

"He is a mean boy."
(mean, rude, nice, cool, sweet, smart)

"I need a new notebook."
(new, thick, thin, lined, blank)

"I have a big dog."
(big, small, little, fat, hairy)

a (n): the first letter of the English alphabet; the highest grade on a school test used before a singular noun that starts with a consonant letter when referring to something; used in place of one when it comes before a word that starts with a used before a singular noun that starts with a consonant letter when referring to something; used in place of one when it comes before a word that starts with a

Used with verbs:

"A is the first letter of the English alphabet."
(be: is/am/are)

"Her name starts with an A."
(starts, begins)

"He got an A on his math test."
(got, received)

ABILITY

ability (n): power and skill to do something

Used with adjectives:

"He has an amazing ability."
(amazing, great, exceptional, outstanding)

"That is a very useful ability."
(useful, useless, helpful, handy)

"Her academic ability is amazing."
(academic, athletic, reading, technical, creative, musical)

Used with verbs:

"I have the ability to draw cartoons."
(have, possess)

"She really displayed her ability to sing."
(displayed, demonstrated, proved, revealed, showed, showed-off)

"Don't underestimate my ability."
(underestimate, question, doubt, ignore)

"I need to improve my ability to draw."
(improve, develop, increase)

"He needs to acquire the ability to communicate effectively."
(acquire, develop)

Used with prepositions:

"I want to improve my ability in drawing."
(in)

ABLE

able (adj): capable of doing something; good at doing something

Used with verbs:

"I am able to go with you."

"He is able to come with me."

"They are able to go together."

(be: is/am/are)

"He seems able to do the work."

(seems, feels)

Used with adverbs:

"I am quite able to walk home alone."

(quite, perfectly)

"They are not financially able to buy a house yet."

(financially)

"The child is not mentally able to do something so difficult."

(mentally, physically)

"I was barely able to see the small letters."

(barely, hardly)

"If you get proper training, you will be better able to do the task."

(better, more)

ABOUT

about (adv): almost; close to doing something

Used with adjectives:

"Are you about ready?"
(ready, finished, done)

"The cake was about gone."
(gone, done, finished)

"I'm about halfway there."
(halfway)

Used with verbs:

"They are about to leave."
(leave, go, depart, take off)

"He is about to get angry."
(get, become)

about (prep): concerning; on the subject of

Used with verbs:

"The movie is about aliens."
(be: is/am/are)

"What do you know about the accident?"
(know, remember, recall)

"Tell me about your experience."
(tell, explain to, describe to)

"Let's talk about it."
(talk, sing, pray, think)

about (adj): moving from one place to another

Used with verbs:

"He is out and about."
(be: is/am/are)

ABROAD

abroad (adv): in or to another country

Used with verbs:

"My daughter is studying abroad for one year."
(be + studying, be + living, be + going)

"They are expanding their business abroad."
(be + expanding, be + exporting)

"Her husband is transferring abroad for work."
(be + transferring, be + traveling)

Example sentences:

"We sent care packages to the troops abroad."

"Her music is popular here and abroad."

"I have never been abroad."

"My dream is to live abroad one day."

ABSOLUTELY

absolutely (adv): completely or totally

Used with adjectives:

"That is absolutely amazing."

"That picture is absolutely gorgeous."

"The little puppy is absolutely adorable."

"Your dress is absolutely beautiful."

(amazing, gorgeous, adorable, beautiful, astonishing, breathtaking, brilliant, extraordinary, fantastic, spectacular) *many additional adjectives

"The trash was absolutely disgusting."

(disgusting, filthy, appalling)

"His performance was absolutely marvelous."

(marvelous, breathtaking, shocking, unbelievable, unforgettable)

Used with verbs:

"I absolutely love your outfit."

(love, adore)

"I absolutely agree with you."

(agree)

"I absolutely guarantee it."

(guarantee, insist, refuse, require, forbid)

ABUSE

abuse (n): bad treatment of someone or something or use of something in a bad way

Used with adjectives:

"He has experienced physical abuse."
(physical, verbal, emotional, sexual, child)

Used with verbs:

"The police work to prevent abuse."
(prevent, stop, end, investigate)

"People are asked to report abuse."
(report)

"He committed abuse."
(committed, experienced, suffered from)

"Abuse takes place everywhere."
(takes place, occurs, happens)

Used with nouns:

"She is an abuse victim."
(victim)

"He has a problem with alcohol abuse."
(alcohol, drug, substance)

abuse (v): to treat someone or something badly

Used with adverbs:

"He physically abuses her."
(physically, verbally, emotionally, sexually)

"They have been badly abusing the dog."
(badly, severely)

ACCEPT

accept (v): to take or receive; to agree

Used with adverbs:

"He gratefully accepted my help."
(gladly, gratefully, reluctantly, graciously, willingly)

Used with verbs:

"I am unable to accept your late homework."
(be + unable to, refuse to)

"I have to accept punishment for my crimes."
(have to, be + forced to, must)

Used with nouns:

"You have to accept responsibility for your actions."
(responsibility, punishment)

"My new school is accepting credits from my previous school."
(credits)

"We are accepting applications at this time."
(applications, volunteers, registrations)

"We accept cash."
(cash, credit cards, checks)

"I accept your suggestion."
(suggestion, recommendation, resignation, criticism) *many additional nouns

ACCEPTABLE

acceptable (adj): good enough; approved by most of a group or society

Used with verbs:

"That idea is acceptable."
(be: is/am/are, seems)

"I find your report acceptable."
(find, consider, deem)

"Her work has become acceptable to her manager."
(has become)

Used with adverbs:

"Your work is perfectly acceptable."
(perfectly, very, fully, totally, mostly, minimally, not at all)

"What you are doing is not culturally acceptable."
(culturally, environmentally, ethically, morally, politically, socially, completely, entirely)

ACCESS

access (n): the ability or right to use something or see someone; an entrance to a place

Used with adjectives:

"He has direct access to the building."
(direct, easy, unlimited, free, unrestricted)

"The elevator provides easy access to my office."
(easy, direct, greater, fast, quick, public, wheelchair)

"This coffee shop provides Internet access."
(Internet, Wi-Fi, wireless)

Used with verbs:

"You cannot gain access without identification."
(gain, have)

"The security guard would not allow access to the building."
(allow, permit, give, grant)

"I was refused access because I did not have a key."
(be + refused, be + denied, be + prevented)

access (v): to be able to use something or enter a building; to be able to open a computer file or website

Used with adverbs:

"She can remotely access her company computer from home."
(remotely)

"She secretly accessed the confidential files on co-worker's computer."
(secretly)

"How can I quickly access my bank account from another country?"
(quickly, immediately)

"He successfully accessed his bank account with the correct password."
(successfully)

"The robbers quietly accessed entrance to the building."
(quietly, secretly, unlawfully)

Used with nouns:

"I need to access my computer."
(computer, files, bank account, funds)

"I need to gain access to the building."
(building, database, website, network)

ACCIDENT

accident (n): something that happens by mistake or without plan; unexpected damage

Used with adjectives:

"She was in a terrible accident."

(terrible, bad, horrible, major, serious, deadly, fatal, minor, auto, traffic, hunting, skiing)

"We found it by pure accident."

(pure, complete, sheer)

Used with verbs:

"We can prevent accidents if we are more careful."

(prevent, avoid)

"How did she survive the accident?"

(survive, live through)

"Lack of sleep caused the accident."

(caused, led to)

"Without proper safety, an accident can occur."

(occur, happen, take place)

"My wife and I met by accident."

(met, found each other, ran into each other)

ACCORDING

according (adj): suitable; appropriate

Example sentences:

"Everything went according to plan."

"The photographer lined the students up according to height."

"Bonuses were given according to performance and seniority."

according (v): as stated by

Example sentences:

"According to my mom, swimming right after eating is bad for you."

"According to my sister, I used to be mean as a child."

"According to the label, the dress is dry clean only."

ACCOUNT

account (n): description of an event; an arrangement with the bank to keep record of how much money a person puts in and takes out; an arrangement with a business showing how much something is owed or was paid for services

Used with adjectives:

"The woman gave an eyewitness account of the crime."
(eyewitness, verbal, written, descriptive, interesting, good, firsthand)

"The book gives a fictional account of history."
(fictional, historical, accurate, false, honest, fascinating, written)

"I would like to open a bank account."
(bank, savings, checking, business, personal, private, joint)

Used with verbs:

"She gave her account of the accident."
(gave, told, provided, offered, wrote down)

"They signed up for a new account."
(signed up for, started, began, have, opened, created)

"He finally paid off his account."
(paid off, settled, satisfied)

"She emptied her bank account."
(emptied, cleared, closed)

"Please charge my account."
(charge, credit, debit)

Used with nouns:

"What is your account number?"
(number, balance)

"Who is the account holder?"
(holder)

account (v): to explain

Used with adverbs:

"Has the money been fully accounted for?"
(fully, completely, entirely, properly)
